Who plans lessons?	Parent	Parent on their portion. School follows Alberta Program of Studies resources on their portion.	School

There has to be demonstrated proof of significant pedagogical interaction between teacher and student (ie proof of instruction) that occurs every 7-10 days of the school year. Just like a physical building school, parents are not expected to teach.
Supervision?	2 visits per year	2 visits per year	The student must attend the class, whether online or in a physical class, a certain number of

			instructional hours every year. Parents may meet the teacher through parent-teacher interviews.
Who gives marks?	Parents. If child is seeking high school marks and credits (credits begin in grade 10) the school authority will give the student the final mark based on APS work presented. (Sec 6 of Home Ed Regs)	Parent gives marks on their portion. School gives marks on their portion.	School (teacher). Parents are not certified teachers employed by the government and do not give marks.
Who is responsible for proof of learning/teaching to Alberta Education?	Parent.	Parent on their portion. School on their portion.	School.
Who is responsible to Alberta Education if the child is not learning?	Parent. If the child doesn't want to do the work, the parent is responsible to the government for the education plan.		School. If the child doesn't want to do the work, the parent is not responsible. The instruction is between the teacher and child, not the parent and child.
My child needs extra tutor help. Can the board charge me for extra classes and teacher instruction?	Yes. You are responsible for providing your child with an education. You can pick and choose where you purchase it.	Yes, on your part of the blend.  No, on the school's part of the blend.	No. The board receives funding for teaching and can't double dip from the government and the parents.

Parents are not entitled to any funding or benefits (direct or indirect) as the school is receiving thousands of dollars per student of "instructional grant" funding to teach the content. Which program has highest parental control?	The parent has the ultimate authority and responsibility for the child's education.	The parent has control over up to 50% of the subjects.
